

Macleay Ward Redland Hospital Graduate Nursing Program

Unit Overview

Macleay is a 26-bed general medical ward located at Redland Hospital. Macleay ward caters to a broad spectrum of patients, including General Medicine, Respiratory, Endocrinology, Palliative Care, Cardiac Overflow, and Delirium and Dementia.

Macleay also houses the Redland Hospital's Dementia Care Unit (DCU); an 8-bed secure section of the ward which creates a therapeutic and safe environment for patients with dementia.

Macleay aims to provide outstanding care in a respectful and safe environment, where patients needs are met in a professional, holistic, and caring approach. We strive always to provide evidence-based, compassionate, quality, patient-centred care, and to create a care environment where we would choose to take our own families to when ill.

Benefits of undertaking a graduate program in Macleay:

- 6-month rotation between both Macleay (Medical) and Stradbroke (Surgical) ward. This provides an excellent foundation for future nursing opportunities.
- Structured graduate nurse program that will support your transition from a novice graduate to a confident and competent practitioner.

- Enrolment and participation in the Acute Nursing Transition Program.
- Access to education team who provide clinically focused education programs, In-Services, and Clinical Workshops.

Graduate Program Overview

The graduate nurse program in Macleay is a shared 12-month Program between Macleay and Stradbroke ward. The graduate program will consist of 11 supernumerary days:

- Corporate/hospital orientation (1 day)
- Nursing orientation, including Digital Training (2 days)
- Orientation to clinical unit/working alongside preceptor (4 days)
- Graduate Nurse Study Days (4 Days)
- 6-month rotation in each ward.

During the graduate year you will be appointed preceptor nurses. Preceptor nurses are experienced role models who will work alongside you during your supernumerary phase and be rostered similar shifts throughout your rotation in Macleay.
